Key indicator 1:

The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that primary school children undertake at least 30 minutes of physical activity a day in school

Key Achievements for 2017/18:

- A successful Sports leader programme was implemented and monitored following 30 Year 5 children completing the Bronze level Sports Leader training.
- Children continued to engage with the 'Golden Mile' initiative.
- A range of clubs were offered across year groups e.g. football, gymnastics and rugby.

- Children were awarded swimming certificates in assembly.
- The Dame Nelson award encouraged children to take part in sports and competitions both inside and outside of school.

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Key indicator 3:

Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

Key Achievements for 2017/18:

- Staff began to assess their own class in fundamental movement skills, analysing data and identifying next steps. Staff confidence in teaching and assessing fundamental movement skills was increased, as shown in a confidence survey.
- Children attended a hockey competition following a member of staff attending a twilight training session on Quicksticks and In2 Hockey.

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Continue to provide a range of after school clubs, increasing the offer for EYFS and KS1 children. External Coaches to be provided to run Rugby for Y2-6 and Football for KS1. Review provision for Year 5/6 to increase participation. This will involve asking children which clubs they would like to see offered and review over the year. This will be tracked through the club tracking system. Continue to promote cycling and complete the Coast to Coast challenge. Year 5 to complete a half term of cycle training at West Denton and staff to identify more able children to progress to the Coast to Coast. Children from Reception to Year 5 to attend a Healthy Active Lifestyles event. Enter the Dance Festival.	Children have access to high quality, active after-school provision.
