Background knowledge

Sir Antony Mark David Gormley, <u>OBE</u> (born 30 August 1950) is a British <u>sculptor</u>. His works include the <u>Angel of the North</u>,

Gormley's career began with a solo exhibition at the <u>Whitechapel Art Gallery</u> in 1981. Almost all his work takes the human body as its subject, with his own body used in many works as the basis for <u>metal casts</u>.

Gormley describes his work as "an attempt to materialise the place at the other side of appearance where we all live."
