Background knowledge

Piet Mondrian, was a Dutch painter and theoretician who is regarded as one of the greatest artists of the 20th century. He is known for being one of the pioneers of 20th-century abstract art,

Mondrian was born in Amersfoort in the Netherlands, the second of his parents' children. He was born 7th March 1872 and died 1st February 1944.

Drawing - A form of art which uses different drawing tools, such as a pencil or charcoal, to make a picture.

Line - A curved or straight mark made with a pencil or pen.

Pencil - A tool for drawing.

Pastels – coloured art material in the form of a stick

Angles - where two lines meet


Pattern - a repeated decorative design.


Shape - Lines that enclose a space eg, square, rectangles, circle.
