Background knowledge

Children should still be focusing mainly on saying words in Spanish. Teachers should be encouraging correct pronunciation. Children should be introduced to the written words and should be reading these where possible. Children should also be writing simple words through labelling pictures and copying simple words or phrases.

In Spanish, the days of the week do not need capital letters.

What should I already know?

A selection of greetings. Ask and answer questions about how they are feeling.
Know the names of ten colours and count 10 objects. Know the names of 10 shapes.
