What should I already know?
In the Autumn term, children learned to use search technologies to find pictures and use keyboard skills to present text, and combine pictures and text together.

Outcomes

An overview of what children will know / can do

Working towards: Children will create a simple presentation with simple shapes.

Expected: Children will create a presentation including a hyperlink to another slide, slide transitions and audio or visual files. They will plan a simple branching story. They will create and organise simple slide templates.

Exceeding: Children will create a presentation including animations to introduce objects on a slide, can set when the visual or audio files play and can evaluate the layout of the slides on a presentation.

Key Vocabulary

Audio files - the sounds in your presentation.

Branching story - a story where the character can follow different paths depending on what you click.

Evaluate - to say what is good about your work and what needs improving.

Font - the different ways a text can be written.

Insert - to put something in.

Keyboard - used for typing.

Layout - the way the slides look.

Microsoft Powerpoint - a programme that helps you make presentations.

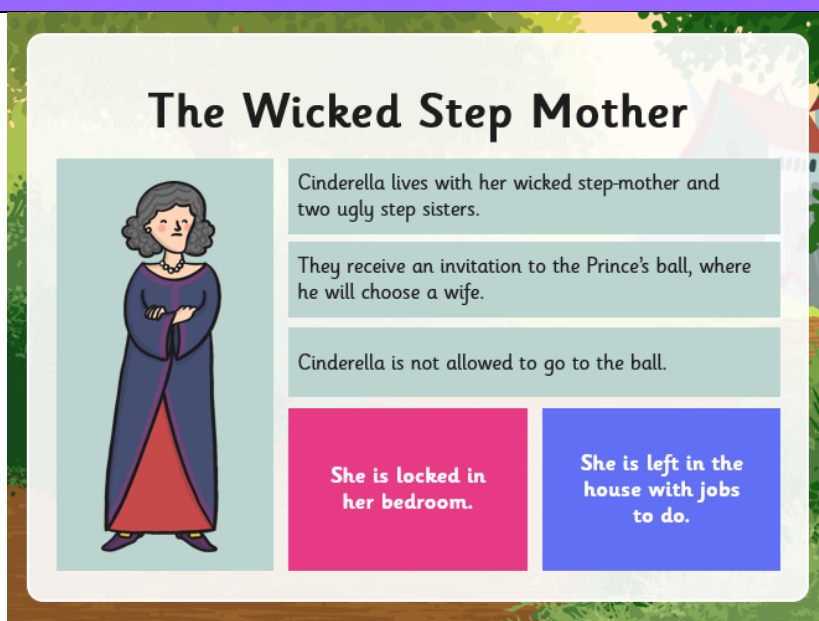
Shortcuts - using two keys on a keyboard to complete a task.

Slides - the pages of your presentation.

Text - the words on the screen.

Visual - the pictures, photos or videos in your presentation.
