## Background knowledge

William Morris (24 March 1834 - 3 October 1896) was a British textile designer, poet, novelist, translator, and socialist activist associated with the British Arts and Crafts Movement. He was a major contributor to the revival of traditional British textile arts and methods of production.

Artist- Someone who creates artwork such as drawings, paintings, collage and sculptures

Colour -



Drawing - A form of art which uses different drawing tools, such as a pencil or charcoal, to make a picture.

Line - A curved or straight mark made with a pencil or pen.

sketch book - A book which you record your thoughts and ideas to help with your final design.

Pencil - A tool for drawing.

Pastels - coloured art material in the form of a stick

Annotate- Make notes

Texture - how something looks or feels.

Charcoal - a small stick of graphite used for drawing.

Materials - different things that can be used to draw with.

Graded pencil - pencils that create different kind of marks.

Shade - exploring light and dark.

Tones - the deepness of a colour.
