Background knowledge

Outcomes

An overview of what children will know / can do

Working towards: Children will understand that what is known about Jesus comes mainly from the Bible. They will understand that people who knew Jesus had different views of him. They can describe different images of Jesus.

Expected: Children will know that evidence for what is known historically about Jesus comes mainly from the New Testament. They will understand that the people who knew Jesus had different views of him and explain the reasons why. Children understand that Jesus has been represented in different ways.

Exceeding: Children know that evidence of what is known of Jesus comes from the New Testament. They understand that people's perceptions of Jesus varied according to their background and experience. Children understand that artists, writers and other thinkers continue to interpret Jesus in different ways.

Key Vocabulary

Christianity - Christians are people who believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God, and who follow his teachings and those of the Christian churches that grew up after his death. Christians believe that Jesus Christ was the Son of God and that: God sent his Son to earth to save humanity from the consequences of its sins.

God - the supreme being who created everything.

Belief - is a firm thought that something is true, often based on revelation. Belief is usually a part of belonging to a religion. It is different to scientific knowledge that can be tested, but belief is not able to be tested. Jesus - was a Jew, and many of his teachings grew out of Judaism. He taught people to forgive others, to live a good life, and to honour God so as to enter God's kingdom. He often taught by using parables, or short stories that illustrated his message. Jesus is the founder of Christianity and Christians believe he is the son of God.


Crucifixion - the act of killing someone by nailing his or her feet and hands to a cross.
