Background knowledge

All with a prompt first. I can repeat and recognise most of the numbers 1-10 in Spanish but I may need a prompt first from counting from 1-10. Exceeding: I can name and recognise all ten colours presented in this unit unaided, from memory and with good accuracy. I can confidently count from 1-10 in Spanish. •I may be able to spell some of the colours and some of the numbers from 1-10 in Spanish.
